Techniques for effective presentations

- 1. Believe in the presentation: You're the expert.
- 2. Be confident / Be proud: You've worked hard on this.
- 3. Have passion: What are you really passionate about?
- 4. Engage with the audience: Use eye contact.
- 5. Be clear in language: Use simple words and phrases.
- 6. Be interesting: Use stories and examples.
