“The blanket challenge”


- Today's activity is about problem-solving, teamwork, and negotiation.
- Your challenge: stand on a blanket and flip it over without stepping off.
- You'll need to communicate clearly and cooperate closely with your team.
- No feet can touch the floor at any point during the challenge!
