

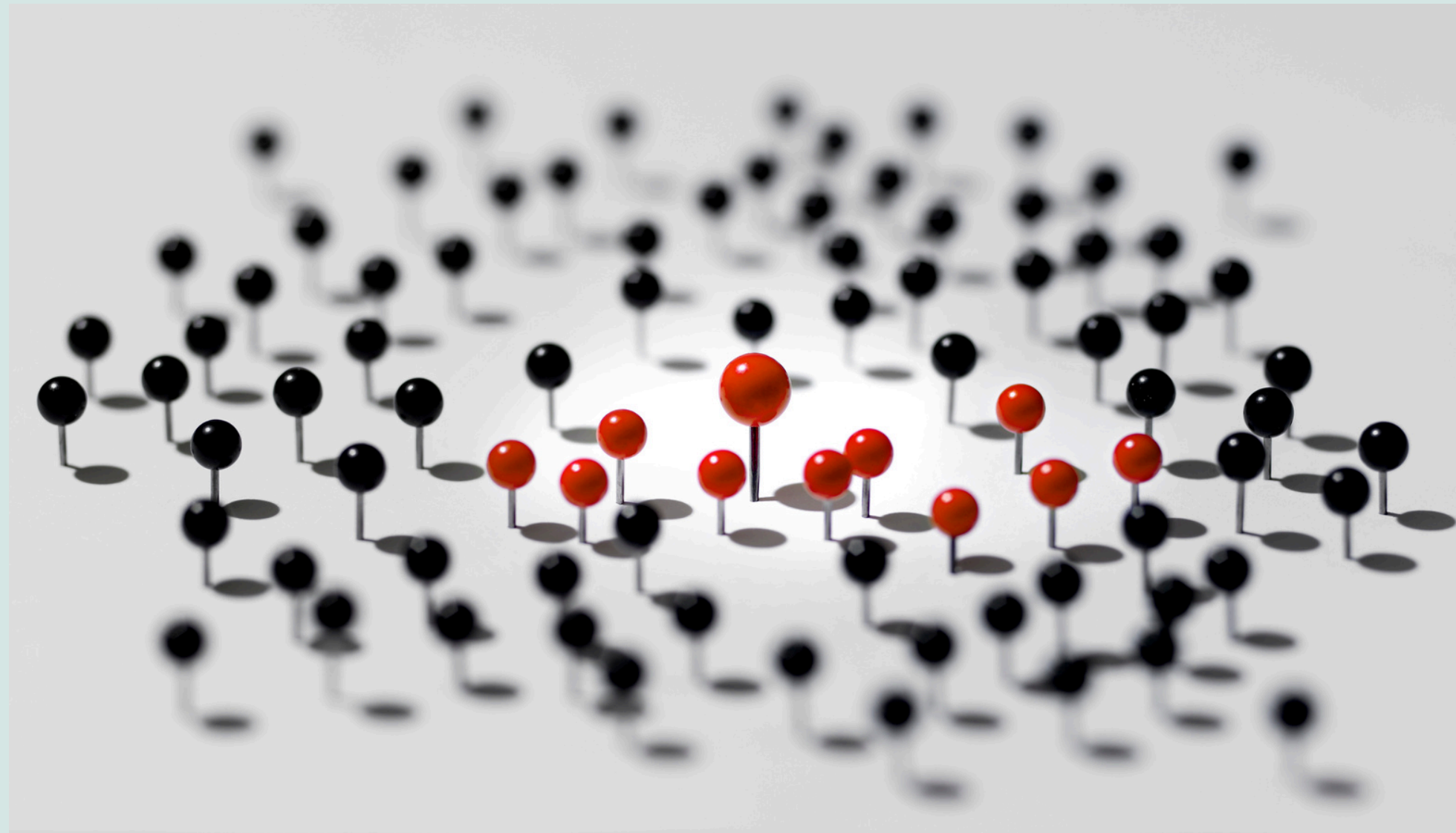

The planet



- **Students work in teams of 3–4 to handle an emergency scenario: Earth will be destroyed soon.**
- **Each team must choose 10 people (from a given list) to board a rocket and repopulate a new planet.**
- **Teams discuss, negotiate, and agree on their final list, then present and justify their choices.**
- **This activity builds skills in communication, negotiation, critical thinking, and teamwork.**
